We are so grateful to all our contributors for their support: Fort Sherman, Unity at 4 meeting, Young in Years, Daily Reprieve, and all the donations we receive in our literature donation box in the office. The events wall is up at Central Office. Please stop by and pick up a flyer to take back to your groups for upcoming events. We now have available "specialty" coins for sale for milestones or any AA anniversary. If we don't have one and you would like a "special" coin, please give us about two weeks notice and we can order for you. New Spring schedules will be out by the middle of March and the color will be pink. David R. has done an excellent job on the Central Office Newsletter. We brought copies of the 2nd Issue of the Newsletter. Please take back to your groups. Copies will be available at the Office, as well. Anyone wanting to submit articles, stories, announcements, funny stuff, etc. to the Newsletter please do so by the last Tuesday of the Month. ACTIVITIES - For expenditures: Sally gave me good info about acquiring supplies. So far, it seems that \$10/month will cover coffee (\$5/pound when I grind it that day, 7 cents/person), cups (6 cents each), tea (4.19/box) and cookies (20-25 cents each) for this crowd, estimate of creamer and sugar (30-55 cents per person roughly). I also priced out and purchased \$14 of scratch baking ingredients at Grocery Outlet and Cash & Carry stores for future use. Request is informal as it is without receipt for now (although I took pictures). It is less than \$30 for at least a couple month's worth over the coming weeks.

Out of curiosity, I attended part of the GSR workshop in Blanchard which appeared to be a *perfect* spot for such an event. I also noticed opportunity for improvement; alas, the event was not on my radar while being planned and I did not help with its execution.

The next GSR school is April 4 in Millwood (10-4 pm with free taco bar @ Zion Lutheran Church on East Buckeye).

At next month's Pre-Conference Assembly, a report is due from the district host committee regarding progress toward Spring 2021 Assembly planning. However, the handbook does not fund this position for travel outside the district. What does the district think?

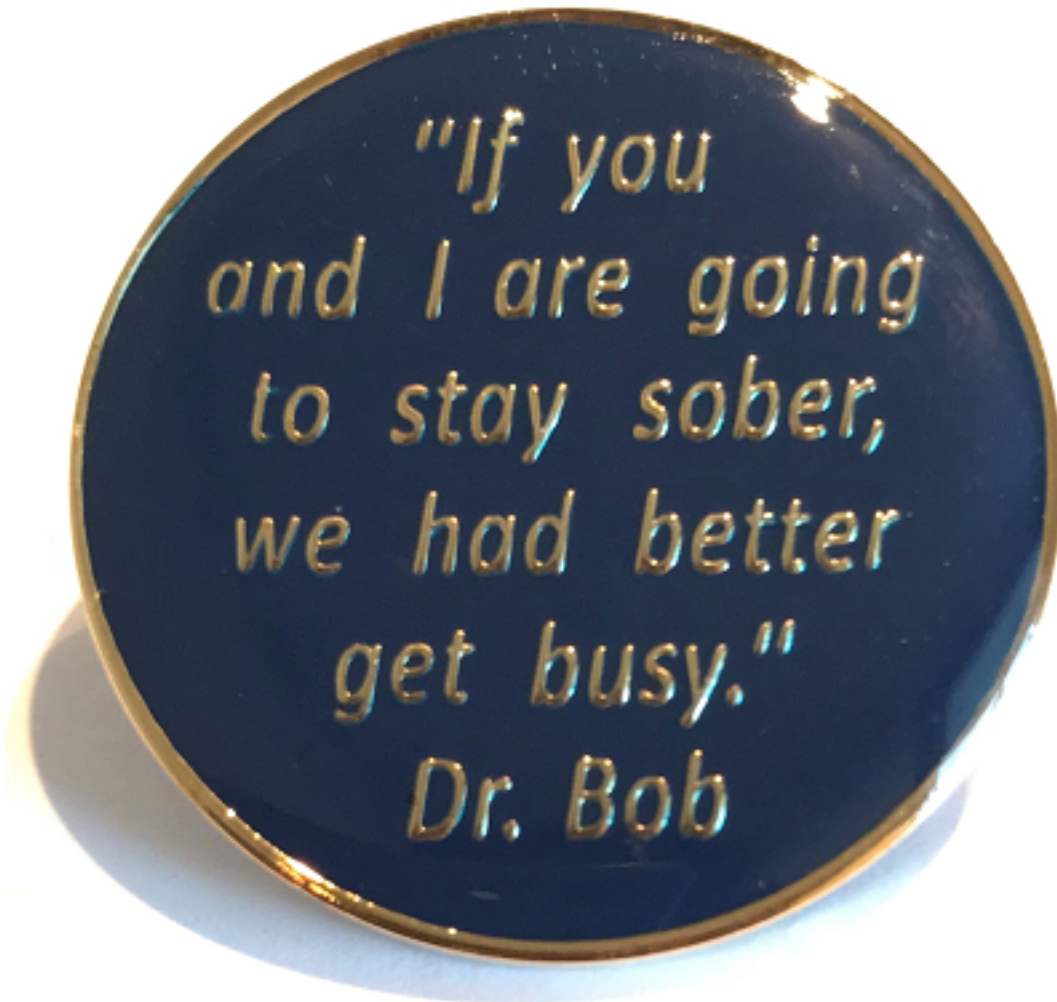

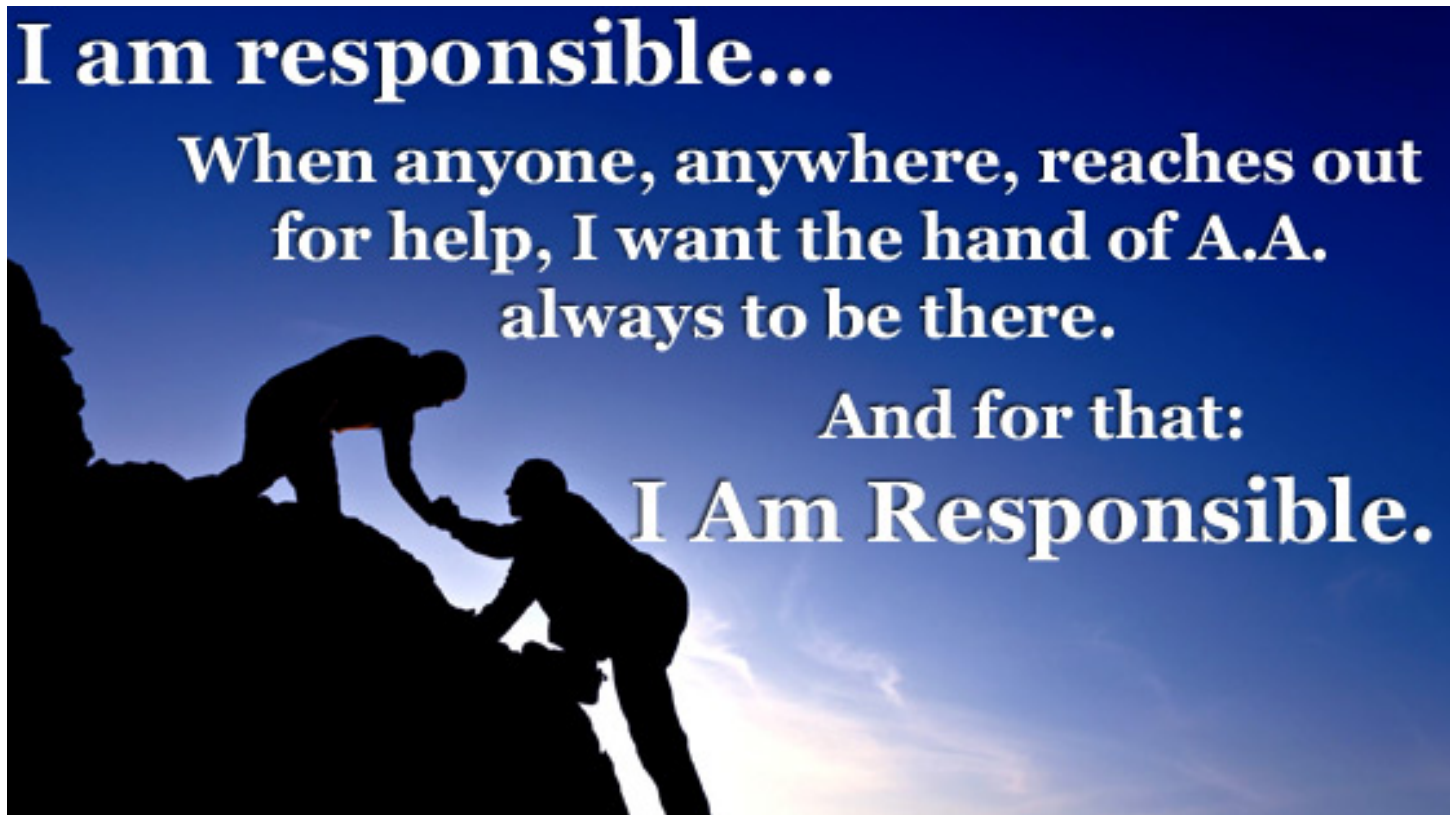

District 8 – North Idaho
FEB. 11, 2020

Called to Order @ 7:00 p.m.

Only minutes addressing old and new business were read as previously voted by the group.

DCM Report: Gina has been working on an ad hoc committee and she has been busy reviewing the many agenda items to be covered at the Pre-Conference Assembly on March 27-29, 2020. We were advised District 8 was given two agenda items to bring to March 26 Pre-Conference Assembly. Those are Treatment and Accessibilities and Archives.

Alt DCM: Cam discussed the January quarterly he attended and upcoming Standing Committee Workshop. Hev will print 30 copies of the handbook.

Treasurer reported a current balance, after rent had been paid of \$1,935.75.

All GSRs gave reports as reflected in the District Eye.
