- 1) Sponsorship / getting sponsees into service
 - Tell your sponsee to find a role! They can join committees (you can 'set up an introduction' between them and a current committee chair, or better yet, have them call the chair and learn about what they're working on & how they can show up and get involved).
 - Notice how you behave among others AAs doing service; "lead by example"
 - Idea: encourage sponsees to 'practice making a motion'
- 2) Branch out / spread the word
 - Participate in a group conscience meeting (doesn't have to be just the HG)
 - Go to other meetings & make announcements about district goings-on, especially those meetings that don't have a GSR doing so
 - We can *make a sign up sheet* and pass it around for people to agree to go to other meetings (call the contact on the 'Meeting Finder' app to check the directions/location etc.);
 - bring copies of the district eye (see above)
 - *Make a motion* to the district to get the district eye printed in larger #s for wider distribution
- 3) Revisit hybrid district meeting
 - Get proper equipment and a point person to resume Zoom; make a *good* online district meeting
 - Especially important for those participating virtually to be able to hear and participate
 - We would *need a motion* for this as well (computer, microphone)
