Cooperation with the Professional Community (CPC) Report

We did not have any committee meetings in the past month, but here's an update:

- A committee member who signed on to contact Kootenai Medical Center's Emergency and Urgent Care met with me and received lots of literature to make available to the Kootenai Medical Center. As of June 2nd, they had not yet made contact with the HR department. Hopefully that will happen this month.
- I had personally (via phone messages) reached out to Kootenai Public Defenders Office, Tribal Court And the County Sheriff's department and had only received a response from the Sheriff who said he was very well supplied with AA literature and resources.
- I contacted the Secretary of the Kootenai County Substance Abuse Council and have scheduled a meeting with her for later in June. She seemed interested in receiving literature and possibly panel discussions which I will discuss with her in more detail when we meet.
- I have just heard back from NIC Nursing Director and received a date for our panel presentation to the Nursing students of October 14, which is exciting. As of June 5th, I have not heard back from the Social Services director but will follow up again to see if we can perhaps to a two for one or another individual presentation for the social work students.
- I revisited some of the facilities in St. Maries such as the Veterans Outreach Center, the Benewah County Public Defender's Office and St. Maries Counseling to whom I supplied literature.
- Lastly, I visited Safe Haven in CDA, which offers counseling, shelter options and other resources and supplied them with AA literature and they said they would make it available in their shelters.
