- Gary B made contact with Kootenai Behavioral Health and Kootenai Urgent care supplying them with pamphlets for patients and healthcare staff working with persons with alcohol problems. Thank you Gary B.
- I made a visit to the St. Vincent de Paul a community service non-profit where they provide many services to persons urgently needing help. They own, operate or manage hundreds of housing units as well as 50 shelter beds. I gave them pamphlets and literature for the professionals who work with those in need as well as for those who are suffering from problems with alcohol.
